The **One Week Induction Programme** is designed to support first-year diploma students in their smooth transition from school to professional education. The key objectives are:

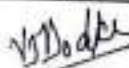
- 1. Orientation to Institute and System**

- 6. Social and Emotional Adjustment**

- 7. Promotion of Values and Discipline**
To inculcate values such as integrity, respect, responsibility, inclusiveness, and adherence to institutional discipline.
- 8. Safety and Well-being Awareness**
To create awareness about anti-ragging policies, cyber safety, health, hygiene, and personal safety.
- 9. Exposure to Career Opportunities**
To guide students regarding career pathways, higher education options, skill development, and industry expectations.
- 10. Encouragement of Holistic Development**
To motivate students to participate in co-curricular and extracurricular activities for overall personality development.

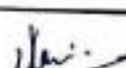
